Message from District Governor Mike Collins

"Where there Is a need, there is a Lion"

Hello Montana Lions,

For me, March in Montana represents the hope of spring. We get a glimmer of spring and new beginnings. There are signs that Covid-19 is starting to diminish, and the number of people being vaccinated is growing. March usually has me thinking about planning for my vegetable garden. What is my vision for how my garden is going to look? What am I going to plant?

This is something we should be doing in our Lions clubs. It is especially important to have a vision for your lion's club. How will your club look by this fall? We need to make some plans for our Lions gardens. What types of service should we be planting? How can we grow our membership? This should be done with written goals and action plans.

Lions Clubs International encourages the use of SMART goals.

SPECIFIC – A specific goal has a much greater chance of being accomplished than a general goal. You will have more focus if your objective is clear.

MEASURABLE – When you measure your progress, stay on track, meet you target dates and experience the exhilaration of achievement that spurs you on to continued effort required to reach your goal. If you can't measure it, you can't manage it.

ACTIONABLE – Make sure you have some control over the accomplishment of your goal. If there is nothing you can do, you won't succeed.

REALISTIC – Goals should be challenging but not so much that there is no chance of achieving them.

TIME BOUND – Set a timeframe for the goal: next week, in three months, by the end of the year. Putting an end point on your goal gives you a clear target toward which to work. Record the goals that your club will pursue to enhance its value to the community and to club members below (use additional pages as necessary).

Once you have a goal or goals turn them into an action plan.

HOW? (Action Steps)

WHEN? (Deadline for completion)

WHO? (Person(s) responsible for action)

HOW WILL WE KNOW? (How we will know if the goal has been accomplished)

My hope that Montana Lions Clubs will emerge from the pandemic with a new focus and able to provide greater service to our communities.

LCI CHARTER AND ENTRANCE FEES WAIVER FLEXIBLE PAYMENTS

The LCI Board of Directors has passed another resolution to help our clubs: **Charter and Entrance Fees Waiver** – The LCI board has waived all charter and entrance fees from January 1 through June 30, 2021.

Flexible Payments – No clubs in good standing on December 31, 2020 will be suspended or canceled through June 30, 2021 for late payment of dues. Full payment is required to be received before June 20, 2021 to avoid suspension or cancellation.

Please note – Clubs placed on financial suspension on December 31, 2020 will remain on suspension until the full balance is paid. Those clubs will still need to address their outstanding dues or make arrangements for repayment with the Accounts Receivable Department at LCI to avoid cancellation scheduled for March 1, 2021.

CLUB MEMBERSHIP BILLING

This past year has been unlike any other as the COVID-19 pandemic has impacted our world in so many ways. To support our Lions during these challenging times, the Board of Directors approved a resolution stating that no clubs will be suspended or canceled through December 31, 2020 for late payment of dues.

Currently, there are a record number of clubs that have not yet paid their balances. We want to make sure you are aware of some important dates and action items that will impact our clubs so we can all work together to support them during this difficult time.

October 25, 2020 – The District Team will be advised on clubs that have not paid their balances within the suspension parameters.

October, November and December Statements – The statements will include a suspension warning to inform clubs of their past due status.

January 1, 2021 – Clubs will be place on Financial Suspension if balances over 120 days are in excess of US\$20/member or over \$1,000. Clubs released from Financial Suspension can expect to be billed for dues for January-June 2021.

March 1, 2021 – Clubs previously suspended will automatically be canceled if their balances are not paid in full.

March-June 2021 – Canceled clubs may be reactivated to Active Status upon receipt of their payment and approval from the district governor.

May 8, 2021 – The suspension cycle will again review clubs for balances unpaid over 120 days with cancelation following on June 29 if payment has not yet been received.

DG RECAPS will be mailed regularly each month. The District Team should review the report and communicate with clubs to encourage payment prior to the end of this calendar year.

We will be sending the list of clubs in suspension to our District Team and Global Action Team leadership each month to support the districts.

Please let us know if you have questions about the process or the timeline. LCI can then ensure that our clubs stay I good standing and continue their great work in time when Lions are needed more than ever. membershipbilling@roar.lionsclubs.org

2021 LCI International Convention Virtual Convention

Due to the continuing concerns about the COVID-19 pandemic, the board of directors voted to transition the 2021 Montreal Lions Clubs International Convention to a virtual event that will be delivered totally online. LCI is still finalizing the details of the new convention experience, and will share those with all Lions as soon as they are ready.

Everyone's Invited – The 2021 convention will be a virtual event that's open to all Lions and Leos around the world: June 25-29.

Registrations Fees – The registration fee will be US\$50.00 until March 31, the US\$75.00 beginning April 1. The registration fee for LEOS will be US\$30.00 regardless of date. Convention is currently scheduled for June 25-29. Additional event and registration details will be provided soon.

Elections – Executive officer and international director elections will be conducted electronically, and voting procedures will be forth coming.

LIONS CLUBS INTERNATIONAL FOUNDATION The Need for Donations

Dear Fellow Lions,

Once again, our nation has been invaded with unspeakable human suffering and death from long lasting freezing temperatures and an off-season tornado.

About 30 years ago Judy and I managed Redwood Retirement in Napa, California. About a week before Christmas the temperature dropped below 32*f for three days freezing the attic plumbing for a water fire suppression system. Four days before Christmas the attic pipes thawed and many of the elbows and tees failed damaging 46 of 96 apartments. Ceilings and insulation fell onto furniture and appliances along with the water. Some residents were sent to nearby sister facilities not affected while others went to be with family until their apartments were once again inhabitable. Those of us that stayed endured a bone chilling cold from the high humidity that hung in the building for weeks. The only bright spots were that we still had our regular water supply and electricity.

Literally hundreds of thousands of people (many fellow Lions) will face more than we did for months to come. Warmer temperature will not solve many of their challenges. LCIF is approving \$10,000 Emergency Response Grants and \$15,000 Emergency Recovery Grants to Districts in the affected areas. But that is not all, because of the magnitude of this crisis other Grants will be made that only International can initiate.

Judy and I are each making a \$50 donation to meet this crisis. We are asking each Lion in District 37 to make a donation of at least \$5, knowing not all Lions can do so. I have also asked all clubs to make a donation at this time.

Requests for reimbursement can be made by submitting an Advertising and Publicity Reimbursement Request to DG Mike Collins either by email or postal mail. Please send one request for funds rather then sending multiple small requests. The form will be published in the newsletter and on the web site. All requests must be submitted by June 1. 2021.
