### PID TOM LEHMAN February 4, 1937 – April 3, 2021



Thomas "Tom" Strauss Lehman, 84, of Missoula, passed away peacefully at home on Saturday, April 3, 2021.

Tom married Judy Comstock in 1996, then moved to their retirement home in Seeley Lake in 1998 and later to Missoula in 2006. He and Judy enjoyed 27 years of traveling the world, golfing, visiting family and friends and chasing grandkids around. They loved snowmobiling, 4-wheeling and spending time at the cabin. Tom loved his cigars, Crown Royal, his country, patriotic flag ceremonies around the campfire, old country music and a good cribbage game.

Tom is survived by his wife Judy Lehman, kids Randy Lehman (Cindy) of Myakka City, Florida; Mike Lehman (Sally) of Lexington, Massachusetts, Lori Kerr (Pete) Seattle, Washington and three step daughters Sandi Sandry (Mike) of Missoula; Kim Herzog (Courtney) of Rapelje and Stacie Cline (Travis) of Drummond. He had ten grandchildren and countless friends that were like family.

PID Tom Lehman was a charter member of the Bozeman Gallatin Empire Lions Club and a senior statesman to the world of Lionism. Knowledgeable in all aspects of Lions, Tom was a respected mentor, advisor and friend to all around him. Lion Tom tirelessly gave of himself at the club, district, multiple district and international level to the very end. Beginning in 1961 Lion Tom served at all club positions and on the District 37A cabinet. During Lions year 1971-1972 he served as District 37A governor. His fellow governors on the MD37 Council of Governors were Angus Murray, 37B;Michael Bolokoski, 37C; Frank Kops, 37D; Gerry Cammaert, 37E and Arnold Fredlund, 37F. During the Lions year of 1979-1980 Lion Tom rose to the occasion referring to himself as a retread and again served as District 37A governor This time his fellow governors

on the MD#& Council of Governors were P.W. (Bill Jones), 37B; E. Roy Hadington, 37C; H. Winston Sproule, 37D; David Dietz, 37E; Bob Brandt, 37F; Barry Golberg, 37G; and Paul Lefebure, 37H. During the 75<sup>th</sup> International Convention held in Hong Kong, June 23-26, 192, Lion Tom was elected to serve a two-year term as a director of the International Association of Lions Clubs. Committee assignments on the International Board included Finance, Nominations and elections and International Parade of Nations. Lion Tom also served one year as an International Board appointee and two years as a member of the USA/Canada Leadership Forum Planning Committee.

It was rare for Lion Tom to miss a club meeting, cabinet meetings, district or multiple district conventions, USA/Canada Leadership Forums or International Conventions. His attendance and participation was an inspiration to all. He loved being a Lion and being with his fellow Lions. In addition to his many accomplishments as a Lion, he was especially proud of his involvement in the formation of the Montana Lions Sight & Hearing Foundation and the Gallatin Empire Lions Foundation. He is already missed but will remain in the hearts and souls of all who had the privilege of being a part of his legacy.

The celebration of Tom's life will be held on Friday, June 11, 2021 at 3:00 PM at the Garden City Funeral Home, 1705 West Broadway Street, Missoula.



**Webmaster:** Are you looking for a fun way to contribute to your Montana Lions District? Or maybe your resume needs a bit of a boost? You could be the District 37 Lions next volunteer web admin! Webmaster administers the District website. Site is a WordPress blog on a commercial server. Webmaster assigns roles (permissions) for others to add, edit, and post items and to create, edit, or send emails to established lists. Using WordPress is similar to using Microsoft Word.

Webmaster is responsible for maintaining the appearance and functionality of the site using WordPress while working with others to provide content. May require about 2 hours per week on no fixed schedule. Basic writing and organizational skills are needed. HTML coding knowledge is a plus. Training and technical support from existing webmaster is available.

**NAMI Team**: The North American Membership Initiative is a program to revitalize Lions Clubs in our district. We need Lions who are willing to start new clubs and increase membership for existing clubs in Montana. This will require attending meetings (zoom for now) and making plans to increase membership. This will include travel once Covid-19 has subsided.

# MONTANA SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF & BLIND FOUNDATION LIONS CLUB PARTNERSHIP

MSDB set a goal to provide all low-vision students in the state with updated technology – saving students from having to push a cumbersome cart with a magnifier down the hall with them to each class. With the help of Lions Clubs throughout Montana, they met that goal before the pandemic hit – equipping students with the technology they need to succeed at both home and school.

Lions Clubs often support projects providing vision support, so Clayton-Bye reached out and was invited to attend their conference.

They set a goal to raise \$300,000 and purchase 100 devices for Montana's low vision students.

"We said if we can meet that goal in two years it would be a dream come true and we met it in eight months with the Lions," Clayton-Bye said, "We want to continue to dream big to open the doors to Montana's deaf, hard of hearing, blind, low vision and deafblind."

# LCI CHARTER AND ENTRANCE FEES WAIVER FLEXIBLE PAYMENTS

The LCI Board of Directors has passed another resolution to help our clubs: **Charter and Entrance Fees Waiver** – The LCI board has waived all charter and entrance fees from January 1 through June 30, 2021.

Flexible Payments – No clubs in good standing on December 31, 2020 will be suspended or canceled through June 30, 2021 for late payment of dues. Full payment is required to be received before June 20, 2021 to avoid suspension or cancellation.

Please note – Clubs placed on financial suspension on December 31, 2020 will remain on suspension until the full balance is paid. Those clubs will still need to address their outstanding dues or make arrangements for repayment with the Accounts Receivable Department at LCI to avoid cancellation scheduled for March 1, 2021.

#### CLUB MEMBERSHIP BILLING

This past year has been unlike any other as the COVID-19 pandemic has impacted our world in so many ways. To support our Lions during these challenging times, the Board of Directors approved a resolution stating that no clubs will be suspended or canceled through December 31, 2020 for late payment of dues.

Currently, there are a record number of clubs that have not yet paid their balances. We want to make sure you are aware of some important dates and action items that will impact our clubs so we can all work together to support them during this difficult time.

October 25, 2020 – The District Team will be advised on clubs that have not paid their balances within the suspension parameters.

October, November and December Statements – The statements will include a suspension warning to inform clubs of their past due status.

**January 1, 2021** – Clubs will be place on Financial Suspension if balances over 120 days are in excess of US\$20/member or over \$1,000. Clubs released from Financial Suspension can expect to be billed for dues for January-June 2021.

**March 1, 20**21 – Clubs previously suspended will automatically be canceled if their balances are not paid in full.

**March-June 2021** – Canceled clubs may be reactivated to Active Status upon receipt of their payment and approval from the district governor.

May 8, 2021 – The suspension cycle will again review clubs for balances unpaid over 120 days with cancelation following on June 29 if payment has not yet been received.

**DG RECAPS** will be mailed regularly each month. The District Team should review the report and communicate with clubs to encourage payment prior to the end of this calendar year.

We will be sending the list of clubs in suspension to our District Team and Global Action Team leadership each month to support the districts.

Please let us know if you have questions about the process or the timeline. LCI can then ensure that our clubs stay in good standing and continue their great work in time when Lions are needed more than ever.

**Elections** – Executive officer and international director elections will be conducted electronically, and voting procedures will be forth coming.

Because of your donations and LCIF's support there are 100 visually impaired Montana students that can read a book, study their lessons and see what is on a PowerPoint presentation. These are students from school districts all over Montana, not from just one city or county. These are students that no longer need to guess at what they are looking at. Those of us that wear glasses know the frustration of trying to read fine print or make out a fuzzy image at a distance. You and LCIF have changed their lives!

Because of your donations and LCIF's support youngsters dealing with childhood diabetes will have an opportunity to participate with peers and share a camping experience with those that understand the challenges they endure. Children with Type-1 Diabetes do not live a "normal" life, and other children and many adults have no idea the lifestyle they must live in order to survive. This will be an opportunity for them to meet other children from all across Montana to learn and share their experiences.

Because of your donations and LCIF's support youth with disabilities will soon be able to fish from a special dock at the Lion's Park in Laurel, Montana. There are few safe and easy accesses for them.

These are just a few of the changes you and LCIF have and will make in the lives of our children. LCIF has and will be there for natural disasters Montanan's have and will face for as long as we support LCIF and its programs. Thank you again for any support you have given or will give to change the lives of those in need or facing challenges.

District 37 has made available funds for reimbursement of advertising expenses for the July 2020- Jun 2021 Lions Year. District 37 will reimburse clubs in good standing up to \$100.00 for expenses for advertising expenses such as social media advertising, google ads, newspaper, radio, or other paid advertising.

It is highly recommended that the advertising should be used to promote your club and club projects, attract new members, and increase public awareness of your Lions club. While the funds may be used to promote a fundraiser, please emphasize what your club is raising the funds for. Social media advertising allows you to get a much bigger impact for your dollar and can be targeted to specific demographics, so it is highly recommended that these funds be used for that type of advertising.

Requests for reimbursement can be made by submitting an Advertising and Publicity Reimbursement Request to DG Mike Collins either by email or postal mail. Please send one request for funds rather then sending multiple small requests. The form will be published in the newsletter and on the web site. All requests must be submitted by June 1. 2021.
