ANNOUNCING A NEW LCIF HUNGER PILOT GRANT PROGRAM! PROJECT EXAMPLES INCLUDE BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO:

* Initiating or expanding of school-based feeding programs

* Supporting the infrastructure needs of food banks, feeding centers, and similar facilities that provide food to communities on a charitable basis

TYPICAL PROJECT EXPENSES MAY INCLUDE:

* Construction and expansion of food banks, feeding centers, and food storage facilities

* Construction or expansion of kitchen or dining facilities as part of a school-based feeding program

- * Purchase of refrigerators and freezers to store perishable food items
- * Kitchen equipment such as stoves and ovens
- * Furniture such as chairs and tables for dining rooms and feeding centers
- * Vehicles to transport, collect and deliver food.

ELIGIBLE PROJECTS SHOULD:

- * Have a strong Lions identity and involvement
- * Provide long term benefits
- * Support efforts too large for one club to undertake alone
- * Mobilize significant matching funds
- * Highlight the presence of Lions in the community and region

- * Requests under \$10,000 or over \$100,000
- * Single club projects
- * Purchase of food
- * Purchase of land
- * Individual assistance (projects should serve the broader community)
- * Projects lacking Lions identity and involvement.


